Jungle vs. Oases of standards

"The Cloud Standards landscape is large but not chaotic and by no means a "jungle"

The "jungle" of standards turned out to be a series of oases rather than a continuous forest

Some issues seems rather well covered while others seem to have no specific standards associated.

What's next?

The Commission's priority now will be to test the results with users

The output would be to indicate which use cases are critical and which related standards have been tested with users

Suggestions for future work

- Certain priority use cases could be identified for further elaboration using the CSC approach
- ETSI up for maintaining and updating the database of use cases and standards to make it a living document?
- EU and US to adopt a reinforced cooperation (e.g. ETSI/NIST) on jointly keeping up such a list of test standards
- Invite ETSI to report to the Commission *crucial* areas where there is no standards or where no standardisation processes exist
